A message from this Sunday's guest clergy

Dear People of St. Mark's,

In preparation for my virtual time with you, Fr. Keith has asked me to provide a brief bio to let you know about my recent adventures. (During an upcoming service I'll be leading you in the Apostle's Creed.)

I am grateful for the times in seasons past when I was able to be with you for Advent and Lenten Quiet Days, as well as helping lead a Vestry Retreat. It is always uplifting and encouraging to be with you and to witness all the ways in which you are expressing the heart of God in your church and in the world. After 40 years of ministry (primarily at Emmanuel in Fullerton) I have been enjoying retirement and getting opportunities for tennis, hiking, flying, music, and a handful of other hobbies I can do either solo or with social distancing. Someone recently gave me the challenge of writing musical settings for the prayer book canticles, so I am currently engaged in this creative pursuit. I am especially treasuring time with family. In this strange and challenging time most of these connections are virtual, but my wife and I recently returned from a road trip to Colorado to visit our son and his family and are giving thanks for this lifegiving opportunity. My current ministry is primarily one on one—spiritual direction and counseling—through Zoom and FaceTime. I will also be doing a Zoom memorial service for the friends and family of my brother-in-law, Karl, who died recently.
